<p>11:45-12:30 p.m.</p>	<p>Collaborative for Advanced Landscape Planning (CALP) <i>Community Energy Explorer-An interactive online energy literacy tool.</i></p> <p>Description: There is a pressing need to transform our communities to meet municipal and provincial targets for greenhouse gas reduction, building climate resilience, and choosing 'greener' alternatives to transportation, energy, waste management and food sourcing.</p> <p>In this context, the Collaborative for Advanced Landscape Planning (CALP) at the Faculty of Forestry, University of British Columbia has developed a unique highly visual web-resource – Community Energy Explorer (www.energyexplorer.ca) that is designed to build energy literacy and capacity among citizens, decision-makers, and local government staff on community energy and related land use issues. The Community Energy Explorer (CEE) provides integrated and interactive information that allows users to explore key concepts of climate change related issues & see their implications through possible alternative scenarios. They have been co-developed with energy/sustainability managers across Metro Vancouver and are intended to develop a more informed citizenry, motivate interest and civic engagement, and encourage social learning. Ryan Jespersen examines the new political landscape, looming legal battles between Canada's westernmost provinces, and the impact federal politics (and courts) play in Canada's shared economic success and environmental survival. Ryan will dig into the upcoming federal election and how the “blue wave” of new conservative premiers could influence what happens in Ottawa.</p> <p>About Ryan Jespersen: Ryan talks news, politics, and pop culture as host of The Ryan Jespersen Show, the province's most-listened-to talk show, on Edmonton's 630 CHED. Recognized as one of Alberta's 50 Most Influential People by Alberta Venture, and as one of Edmonton's Top 40 Under 40 on Avenue Magazine's inaugural list, Ryan's established himself as a mover and shaker in Alberta's capital city.</p> <p>Ryan has extensive experience in media, having worked in newspaper and television (including six years as host of Breakfast Television) before moving to talk radio.
